Core Value Proposition

Building The ACF Family & Community

Goal 1: Teach, apply, and implement consistent biblical principles on individual responsibility, marriage, and the family.

Actions/Activities:

1. Identify core biblical principles for individual living, marriage, and family.
2. Encourage personal spiritual growth through bible study, prayer, and consistent godly living
3. Organize marriage and family seminars and retreats.
4. Encourage the use of pastoral counseling services if and when necessary
5. Gather, maintain, update and apply objective data on the family and community
6. Hold members accountable to the core principles on individual and family living

Building The ACF Family & Community

Goal 2: Teach and encourage effective communication among family members.

Actions/Activities:

1. List, clarify, and publicize our common family values
2. Encourage families and fellowships to set family/fellowship goals
3. Implement frequent and consistent family meetings and devotions
4. Organize relevant teachings, seminars, and workshops on communication
5. Encourage and facilitate family to family mentoring

Goal 3: Consistently apply biblical principles of economics and stewardship at family and fellowship affairs.

Actions/Activities:

1. Educate, train, and counsel members towards a successful life
2. Develop and implement individual, family, and fellowship budgets
3. Provide training programs on financial management
4. Demonstrate faithfulness in giving at the individual, family and fellowship levels
5. Encourage diligence, resourcefulness, business development, and generosity at all levels

Building The ACF Family & Community

Goal 4: Recognize and account for the cultural and environmental factors that impact on our values, performance and effectiveness.

Actions/Activities:

1. Consider the cultural diversity of members in program planning
2. Organize seminars on cultural issues within a biblical framework
3. Encourage productive dialogue between adults and youth, parents and children
4. Organize special activities such as training, picnics, excursions, for the children
5. Organize workshops on the American society and our mutual expectations

Building The ACF Family & Community

Goal 5: Increase the total membership of the Fellowship by at least 10% per year

Actions/Activities

1. Train ACF leaders to articulate the ACF vision
2. Organize evangelistic events and activities such as bible studies
3. Organize Africa Day activities each year
4. Develop and disseminate information on the Fellowship
5. Recruit other organizations and groups for full or affiliate membership
6. Seek referrals of arriving potential members from ministers and groups in Africa

Building The ACF Family & Community

Indices of progress/success:

1. Absent or minimal levels of divorce among members.
2. Retention of visitors to the fellowship.
3. Absent or few quarrels at home.
4. Level of confidence and peace children experience about their families and future.
5. Behavior and manners of children.
6. Consistent activities for the children.
7. Readiness of children to go to fellowship.

Building The ACF Family & Community

Indices of progress/success:

8. Maturity in Christian life (readiness to apply what one knows to deal with decisions and issues).
9. Professional and career advancement.
10. Decreasing debt level.
11. Increasing net worth.
12. Cross-national friendships/visitations and interactions.
13. Academic progress and achievements of children.
14. Increasing numbers of member's - total and culturally diverse).

RECONNECTING WITH THE CONTINENT

Goal 1: Support missionary activities in Africa

Actions/Activities

1. Develop aggressive, imaginative, and transparent programs to raise funds and resources both from within and outside the Fellowship to support missions
2. Actively support the training and development of missionaries in Africa.
3. Sponsor Christian missionaries and organizations to work among un-reached Africans both in the continent and in the Diaspora.
4. Create and maintain a database of trustworthy Christian Churches and Ministries in Africa and among Africans in the Diaspora for use in communication and support.
5. Provide Christian literature, tapes, videos and films to stimulate growth and development of Christians and Churches in Africa.

RECONNECTING WITH THE CONTINENT

Goal 2: Promote economic investments in Africa

Actions/Activities

1. Create and maintain a database of expertise within the fellowship to draw upon for consultations and actions to help economic development in Africa
2. Facilitate business partnerships between American and African companies.
3. Encourage the establishment of businesses by Fellowship members in Africa
4. Supply educational materials, books, equipment and computers to educational institutions in Africa.
5. Facilitate the exchange of scholars between Universities in the Continent and in the United States.
6. Support the establishment of quality schools in needy communities in Africa.

RECONNECTING WITH THE CONTINENT

Goal 3: Mobilize relief efforts for Africa

Actions/Activities

1. Organize and undertake humanitarian relief efforts in Africa to demonstrate Christian love and compassion to needy Africans.
2. Identify and establish relationships with agencies in the United States who provide relief materials.
3. Collect and distribute relief materials in the event of emergencies in the United States thereby also developing a record of sources and experience for potential action in Africa
4. Seek membership on Boards and teams of organizations undertaking relief activities in Africa
5. Maintain a news network to be informed of actionable events in Africa

RECONNECTING WITH THE CONTINENT

Goal 4: Enhance the health and social well-being of people in Africa

Actions/Activities

1. Solicit dental, medical, pharmaceutical and hospital supplies for shipment to Africa.
2. Mobilize volunteer teams of professional and technical experts for short-term services in Africa.
3. Recognize individuals and organizations for their exemplary service to Africa
4. Support the development of strategic infrastructure all over Africa

RECONNECTING WITH THE CONTINENT

Goal 5: Educate ACF members on current issues and needs in Africa

Actions/Activities

1. Regularly publish and circulate informative Newsletters and Reports on the Fellowship's mission activities and needs.
2. Organize mission awareness activities for the benefit of our members.
3. Publish a brochure of ACF activities in Africa and circulate to other relevant organizations
4. Maintain an internet news link and news mailing list for members
5. Invite missionaries, indigenous, and other workers in Africa to speak on missions and welfare issues

RECONNECTING WITH THE CONTINENT

Goal 6: Recognize and promote positive African culture

Actions/Activities

1. Encourage and organize tourist trips to Africa.
2. Create and maintain a database of host families in various African nations to receive tourists.
3. Establish regional cultural, library, or community centers to teach and promote core Godly African values such as respect for elders, care for the elderly and the young, responsibility of the youth, entrepreneurship, responsibility to the extended family, chastity, honor, integrity, resilience and resourcefulness.
4. Encourage parents to teach their children their native (vernacular) language.
5. Develop aggressive, imaginative, and transparent programs to raise funds and other resources both from within ACF and outside for promoting Godly African cultural values.

PASSING ON THE LEGACY

Goal 1: Equip ACF parents to consistently demonstrate practical Christian living before our children.

Actions/Activities

1. Encourage parents to create a home environment that is conducive to effective discussion and interaction with their children
2. Encourage parents to review their lives with their children
3. Organize training workshops for parents on effective child rearing habits
4. Conduct surveys of parents on child training issues and apply the results to enhance the quality of training and the effectiveness of child learning
5. Create an attractive atmosphere to encourage the children to participate in activities at home and at the Fellowship.

PASSING ON THE LEGACY

Goal 2. Train the children to clearly understand, accept, and articulate the ACF vision

Actions/Activities

1. Publicize the tenets of the ACF vision
2. Teach ACF children the meaning and purpose of the ACF vision
3. Provide opportunities for the children to participate in implementing the ACF vision
4. Organize camps, seminars, Bible clubs, quizzes, and role modeling sessions for our children
5. Provide materials to assist the children in learning the Bible
6. Encourage the children to apply biblical principles in their daily living
7. Establish local Christian libraries or exchanges to provide books, videos, tapes, and similar media for the benefit of children and parents

PASSING ON THE LEGACY

Goal 3: Nurture and maintain the values and purpose of the African Christian heritage

Actions/Activities

1. Narrate, teach and write on our African Christian heritage
2. Motivate our children to excel in every endeavor
3. Establish regional libraries or reading centers to contain diverse media for education and training in our heritage
4. Organize or support the organization of games, sports, social activities
5. Organize educational trips to Africa and develop fund raising strategies to enable parents and the fellowship to support such trips

PASSING ON THE LEGACY

Goal 4: Facilitate the contextual implementation of the ACF Vision

Actions/Activities

1. Establish and promote ACF campus ministry
2. Work with Campus Ministries to identify and encourage African Christians
3. Initiate efforts to educate local schools about African culture
4. Promote exchange programs or au pairs with school children in Africa
5. Organize niche fellowships and activities within the Fellowship.

BUILDING BRIDGES

Goal 1: Foster reconciliation, unity and understanding with Christian groups and persons

Actions/Activities

1. Establish a yearly Africa Day event at local and regional levels that includes representation of the entire African and non-African constituencies
2. Incorporate ACF action plans on building bridges into relevant ACF activities at Chapter, Regional, and National levels
3. Engage in dialog aimed at improving understanding and collaboration among target Groups.

BUILDING BRIDGES

Goal 2: Foster collaboration with appropriate organizations, agencies and persons

Actions/Activities

1. Clearly identify representative constituencies with whom we need to work
2. Identify areas of common interests and differences with these constituencies through survey from within and outside the fellowship
3. Maintain a policy statement that clearly defines the independent, nondenominational, ministerial position of the Fellowship in regard to relationships with other organizations and people groups
4. Leverage our spiritual, economic, and political capabilities to facilitate the achievement of the ACF goals and objectives
5. Enable a bridge building task force to create effective communication and marketing strategies, prints, media, technology, and outcomes assessments.

BUILDING BRIDGES

Goal 3: Enhance positive mutual perceptions of Africans and other people groups

Actions/Activities

1. Establish functional relationships at the regional level with representatives of the identified constituencies. E.g., work jointly on common projects
2. Identify and deal with issues of misunderstanding between African and African Americans openly and objectively
3. Educate members on the history and contributions of various groups, notably the African Americans, in the United States
4. Initiate mutual exchange of speakers and participation in programs between the Fellowship and the African American churches and other groups

BUILDING BRIDGES

Goal 4: Increase and maintain the membership and participation of all African countries in the Fellowship to the proportion of their national populations.

Actions/Activities

1. Evaluate the national composition of the Fellowship on a yearly basis in order to inform and direct the deployment of special recruitment efforts
2. Eliminate language barriers without stifling cultural expression in the Fellowship
3. Use inclusive language and programming and distributed selection of projects
